We kicked off our All in for Kids capital campaign, the first for CIS! Rising officing costs in Austin were pushing us out of our current location. As good stewards, we moved to action to find a solution to keep our operating cost down. We watched in awe as our community of support enabled us to start building a home of our own. As part of our commitment to service, we are bursting with excitement at the opportunity to continue to support and empower students and families in our Southeast Austin Central Office and Training Center, in Fall 2024.

The year ahead holds great promise for our students. Our Mental Health and Wellness team is set to deploy a full complement of Mental Health Counselors, providing individual interventions for students across all education levels. Supported by a cohort of interns, this department will continue upholding our enduring commitment to student well-being over the coming year.

As we anticipate the future, we look forward to continuing this journey hand in hand.

Communities In Schools of Central Texas (CIS) is a local affiliate of a national nonprofit recognized for its evidence-based model that ensures every student, regardless of race, zip code, or socioeconomic background has what they need to realize their potential in school and beyond. Working directly inside schools, we connect students to caring adults and community resources that help them see, confront, and overcome the barriers that stand between them and a brighter future. Together, we build a powerful change movement made up of peers, students, and alumni committed to building a path to education for future generations.

Strategic Plan Update

We are entering the third year of our Strategic Plan, which is designed to support program and operational excellence. In support of the goals in our plan, we want to share two major updates.

In committing to operational excellence, we took the first steps in conceptualizing and building our new Central Office and Training Center, which came about as the city of Austin faced both rising housing and operational costs. The All in for Kids campaign was our very first capital campaign, and its goal was to ensure that from a programmatic, operational, and strategic standpoint, we can continue to serve the student and family populations in our communities.

As we continue to support programs from our current office location, we are eager to make the move to a location where we will be able to offer our staff, students and families so much more.

Over the 2022-2023 school year, our Performance Measures and Data department finalized preparation to launch our new, integrated data management system in the next school year. Apollo, our client relationship management database, is built on a Salesforce platform, and provides a fully-integrated approach to data entry and real-time analysis and reporting. This allows our direct service staff to make informed decisions about student and family supports with real-time data. After feedback sessions and beta-testing, we launched Apollo as part of our back-to-school trainings in early August 2023. We are proud to see our campus-based staff off with strong data practices and a streamlined process to increase efficiency and sustainable excellence.

This past school year, CIS also focused heavily on developing more activities and training staff on best practices for youth enrichment and family engagement. Activities included hosting district-wide meetings and events, creating curricula and resources for summer programming, and expanding out of school time partnerships. Our staff also coordinated 17 field trips, including a family field trip with approximately 300 attendees. Internally, we developed a family conversation guide and cultural humility training that was completed by all staff.

Additionally, CIS began piloting the new Mental Health & Wellness counseling team to provide focused, intensive clinical services and mental health support to students and families in crisis. In its first year, a team of 3 licensed professional counselors engaged students at 7 schools in 8-10 individual sessions, which included life skills training, grief counseling, cognitive behavior therapy, trust-based relational interventions, play therapy, and role playing. For year two of the pilot, the team is hiring 3 additional counselors and will support students at 36 schools. More detail on this program can be found on our website: www.ciscentraltexas.org.

This school year, the team is thrilled to have expanded to 11 new schools within six partner districts. This expansion has been partly subsidized by a generous grant from CIS National, financed by the Ballmer Group.



Our Community-Based Approach

Our unique model is built around having at least one—and often more—dedicated, direct care professionals working full-time at each campus that we serve. We also maintain relationships with businesses, volunteers, social service agencies, and health care providers to supply community resources to the school campus. This extra support makes sure that students receive the exact services they need.



CIS Layered Supports: Specialized Programs



As a complement to providing individualized student supports full time on campuses, Communities In Schools also offers the following specialized programs:

- ASPIRE Family Literacy: comprehensive literacy services for the entire family
- Care Coordination: intensive wraparound family support services
- Male Student Achievement Program: transformative leadership, peer, and postsecondary attainment support for young Central Texas males
- Mental Health & Wellness: access for students to support needed to cope with mental health and wellness challenges
- **SmartKids:** on-campus and after-school supports for children living in Austin public housing
- Youth Enrichment: stimulating, hands-on summer camps to foster exploration, discovery, and new beginnings


